Dear Nikola,

On behalf of the SEG/EAGO/EAGE Moscow 2003 Technical Program Committee, we would like to invite you to present your paper, "Role of enormous changeable Earth magnetic fields (CEMF) intensities in etiopathogenesis of mental disturbances and illnesses (MDI)" at the Moscow 2003 International Geophysical Conference and Exposition, Moscow, Russia, at the World Trade Center. Your paper is scheduled for presentation on September 4, 2003.

All submitted papers were carefully reviewed by people with expertise in the appropriate area of geophysics and were rated on the basis of the submitted abstract and accompanying figures. The reviewers felt that your abstract represents a significant technical contribution that will be of interest to many SEG/EAGO/EAGE members.

The full Committee met in May to arrange the presentations into sessions with a clear theme and focus. Your paper has been included in <u>Oral Session 18 (OS18), Environmental Geophysics</u>, which begins on <u>September 4, 2003 between 9:00 and 12:30 located in Hall B</u>. I encourage you to take a look at the other papers in your session. During the week of June 23 you will be able to see the exact time you begin your 20-minute presentation.

You can also find on the Moscow 2003 web site a copy of the **SEG Oral Speakers' Manual** giving you guidelines and tips for a successful presentation. All papers submitted in English will be simultaneously translated into Russian during the session.

The Speakers' Meeting is scheduled on Monday, September 1, from 11:00am - 1:00pm in the Conference Hall at the World Trade Center. It is very important that you attend this meeting and this will be your only opportunity to meet with the Technical Session Chairmen concerning your session. The Opening Ceremony/Plenary Session will begin at 2:00pm after the meeting.

A **Speaker's Aid Room** (located close by the Conference Hall) will be available for you to practice your oral presentation.

The latest information in our database shows you have selected **PC-Based** for your presentation style. If this is not correct, please send an email to pterekhova@seg.org\_and inform us of any changes, please include the paper title in the subject line of the email. 35mm slide projectors will not be available.

If you cannot make your designated date, please inform us at pterekhova@seg.org as soon as possible, and at least six weeks in advance of the meeting. By accepting your paper, we are counting on you to be present at the assigned time to give your presentation. The SEG/EAGO/EAGE will consider past "no shows" when selecting papers for future meetings. We want to see your presentation. Don't be a "no-show!"
